Committee Agenda:

The Current Crisis between Israel / United States and Iran

The committee will deliberate on the escalating geopolitical tensions and military confrontation between Israel, the United States, and Iran.

The conflict intensified in February 2026 following joint military strikes by Israel and the United States on Iranian targets, which triggered retaliatory missile and drone attacks across the region.

Delegates will discuss possible diplomatic, strategic, and humanitarian responses to de-escalate tensions and maintain global stability.

About Model United Nations:

Model United Nations (MUN) is a simulation of the United Nations, where participants assume the role of diplomats representing different countries and debate international issues through structured parliamentary procedure.

The conference aims to develop:

- Critical thinking and policy analysis
 - Public speaking and diplomacy
- Negotiation and consensus-building skills
- Awareness of international relations

RULEBOOK

Committee Overview

The United Nations Security Council (UNSC) consists of fifteen member states. Five of these members are permanent members and ten are non-permanent members.

The permanent members of the Security Council are:

- United States
- United Kingdom
- France
- Russia
- China

These five members possess veto power during the voting procedure.

Executive Board

Each committee will be chaired by a Chairperson. The Chairperson is responsible for conducting the proceedings of the committee, maintaining order during debate, and ensuring that all rules of procedure are followed.

All decisions made by the Chair regarding procedure are final during the conference.

Delegate Conduct

Delegates are expected to maintain professionalism and diplomatic decorum throughout the conference.

Delegates must

- Represent the official policy and interests of their assigned country
 - Address other delegates respectfully
 - Speak only when recognized by the Chair
 - Follow all procedural rules of the committee

Personal attacks, offensive remarks, or disruptive behaviour will not be tolerated.

Roll Call

Each committee session will begin with a roll call. During roll call, delegates must respond with either:

“Present”

or

“Present and Voting.”

Delegates who respond with “Present and Voting” must vote either Yes or No during voting procedures and may not abstain.

General Speakers List (GSL)

Once the agenda is set, debate begins with the General Speakers List (GSL).

Delegates who wish to speak may request to be added to the speakers list. When recognized by the Chair, delegates may present their country’s position, discuss the issue, and propose potential solutions.

The speaking time for each delegate will generally be between 60 and 90 seconds, unless otherwise specified by the Chair.

Points

Delegates may raise points in order to clarify procedural matters or address personal concerns.

Point of Personal Privilege

This point may be raised when a delegate experiences personal discomfort or is unable to hear the proceedings clearly.

Point of Order

This point may be raised if a delegate believes that the rules of procedure are not being followed.

Point of Parliamentary Inquiry

This point is used to ask the Chair questions regarding the rules or procedures of the committee.

Motions

Delegates may propose motions to direct the flow of debate.

Moderated Caucus

A moderated caucus is a focused discussion on a specific subtopic within the agenda.

The delegate proposing the motion must specify:

- The topic of discussion
- The total duration of the caucus
- The speaking time for each delegate

Delegates may speak only when recognized by the Chair.

Unmoderated Caucus

An unmoderated caucus allows delegates to move freely within the committee room to discuss ideas, negotiate solutions, and collaborate on draft documents. During this period, delegates may form alliances and begin drafting working papers or draft resolutions.

Working Papers

Working papers are informal documents prepared by delegates that outline possible solutions or proposals regarding the agenda.

Working papers help delegates collaborate and refine their ideas before submitting a formal resolution.

All working papers must be reviewed by the Chairperson before being circulated in the committee.

Draft Resolutions

Draft resolutions are formal documents that present proposed actions or solutions to the issue being discussed.

Each draft resolution must include:

Preambulatory Clauses

These clauses provide background information and context regarding the issue.

Operative Clauses

These clauses outline the specific actions that the committee recommends.

Draft resolutions must be approved by the Chairperson before they are introduced for debate.

Voting Procedure

Once debate has concluded, the committee will move into voting procedure.

During this time:

- The committee room will be secured
- No delegate may enter or leave the room
- No further discussion will be allowed

Delegates may vote:

- Yes
- No
- Abstain

A resolution passes if it receives the required majority of votes.

Veto Power

In the United Nations Security Council, the five permanent members possess veto power.

If any permanent member votes “No” on a substantive resolution, the resolution will not pass regardless of the number of affirmative votes. However, veto power does not apply to procedural matters.

Final Authority

The Chairperson and the Secretary of the Literary Club reserve the right to interpret and enforce all rules contained in this document.

Their decisions regarding procedure and conduct are final during the conference.
